Educational philosophy

Our curriculum is designed to meet our mission and goals by putting learning into the child's hands. With over 350 acres of prairie, streams, and woodland to explore, students immerse themselves in seasonal themes by taking nature walks, studying natural phenomena, and engaging in activities that build physical, emotional, and academic skills.

Mission & goals

Mission: To nurture whole child development through authentic and meaningful experiences with nature.

Goals: Foster curiosity through inquiry, hands-on projects, and play. Stimulate intellectual, social-emotional, and physical development. Develop respect and appreciation for the natural world.

2018-2019 program year

Natural Beginnings school year runs from September to May. We offer two-day and three-day classes for children ages 3-6. Class times run from 9-11:30 or 12-2:30. Maximum class size is 12 students with a teacher-student ratio of 1 to 6.

Fees

Yearly program fees for the two-day class are \$1,540 and our three-day class is \$1,840.
